Chronic wasting disease (CWD) is an emerging infectious disease that is fatal to free-ranging and captive animals in Cervidae, the deer family. CWD is one member of a family of diseases called transmissible spongiform encephalopathies (TSEs), and is thought to be caused by prions. CWD is the only TSE known to affect free-ranging wildlife.

The definition of kuru as both neurodegenerative (not inflammatory) and infectious [14,15] led to subsequent transmission of Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (CJD) [] and suggested that kuru represents a novel class of diseases caused by a novel class of pathogens called prions.Kuru won a Nobel prize for Gajdusek in 1976 and, indirectly, as he discovered "prions", for Stanley B. Prusiner in 1997.

Chronic wasting disease (CWD) is a fatal, neurological illness occurring in North American cervids (members of the deer family), including white-tailed deer, mule deer, elk, and moose. Since its discovery in 1967, CWD has spread geographically and increased in prevalence locally. CWD is contagious; it can be transmitted freely within and among cervid populations.

The United States complies with the conditions in the Terrestrial Animal Health Code of the OIE as a country that presents a "controlled risk" for bovine spongiform encephalopathy. The method of stunning cattle does not include the use of compressed air or gas injection in the cranial cavity or a pithing process.

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
