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Present Perfect Or Past Simple

We use the past simple for past events or actions which have no connection to the present. We use the present perfect for actions which started in the past and are still happening now OR for finished actions which have a connection to the present. We CAN'T use the present perfect with a finished time word: NOT: I've been to the museum yesterday. Present Perfect or Past Simple Tense?

We use the present perfect with how long, for, since to talk about actions or situations that started in the past and still continue or are still true now. We use the past simple with how long, for, since to talk about actions or situations that started and finished in the past. Compare:

Simple Past vs. Present Perfect Simple - English Grammar

Both Present Perfect and Past Simple are used to talk about a completed action. The difference is the following: Present Perfect denotes recent actions and events which are connected with the present. Past Simple denotes actions and events in finished time periods (last week, yesterday, at the weekend, etc.).

The difference between the two tenses is that the simple past is for finished action and the present perfect is for unfinished actions or states or habits that started in the past and continue to the present. Would the following examples be correct way to distinguish the two tenses? John just left the room. He will be back in two hours.

just(recently) + present perfect or simple past - English ...

Present Perfect – Simple Past – contrasted They all the new words. They needn't worry about the test. (to learn) Three people him in hospital last Friday. (to visit)

Present Perfect or Simple Past - Exercise

Both present perfect and past perfect talk about something that happened before a point in time (reference point). In the present perfect, our reference point is the present. In the past perfect, our reference point is in the past.
